# 1. Proper use

The KOSTAL Solar Portal, manufactured by KOSTAL Solar Electric GmbH, is a free Internet platform for monitoring PV systems.

The KOSTAL solar inverter sends the PV system's yield data and event messages to the KOSTAL Solar Portal via the Internet.

The information is then stored in the KOSTAL Solar Portal. You can view and call up this information via the Internet.

## 2. About this manual

Read this manual carefully in its entirety. It contains step-by-step instructions.

We recommend you print them out and follow them step-by-step to set up the KOSTAL Solar Portal.

Most of the user guidelines are self-explanatory. Every webpage has its own help texts. To view these texts, simply click on the linked word “More”.

The most recent version of the operating manual for your product is available in the [download area at www.kostal-solar-electric.com](http://www.kostal-solar-electric.com).

### **Target group**

This manual is intended for PV system installers who set up PV plants and put them into operation. Technical expertise is required to use the KOSTAL Solar Portal correctly. For this reason, we recommend the KOSTAL Solar Portal is only installed by a properly qualified technician.

Information concerning your safety or that of the unit is specifically highlighted.

## 2.1 Navigation through the document

In order to enable navigation through this document, it contains clickable areas.

One of these is the navigation bar in the header of each page. By clicking here, you are taken to the overview pages of the individual chapters.

The table of contents can also be used in this way: From the index at the beginning of each chapter you can go to the indicated sub-chapter with a click.

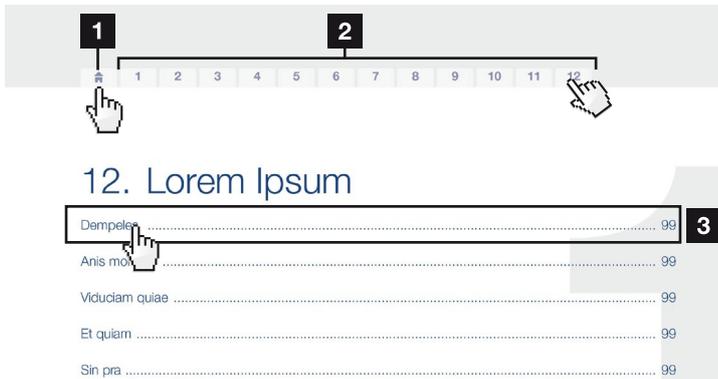


Fig. 1: Navigation through the document

## 2.2 Notes in this manual

**Installation** ⚠️

Installing the wall mount and hanging the inverter

- Mark the positions of the drill holes at the installation site by using the wall mount as a drilling template.
- Drill holes and insert wall anchors if necessary.
- Screw the wall mount to the intended surface.
- Use the supplied screws.

**Connecting AC-side** ⓘ

We recommend a mains cable with the cross-section  $3 \times 2.5 \text{ mm}^2$ . The outer diameter of the cable can be 9...17 mm, the cross-section of the individual conductors can be a max. of  $4 \text{ mm}^2$  for flexible cables and a max. of  $6 \text{ mm}^2$  for rigid cables. For flexible cables, we recommend using core end sleeves.

Remove the sheath and the insulation of the mains cable as much as needed.

First thread the unscrewed union nut and then the sealing ring over the cable. ⓘ

**DANGER**

Risk of death due to electrical shock  
Always disconnect the device from the power supply during installation and before maintenance and repairs and lock it to prevent it being switched back on.

**IMPORTANT NOTE**

Press the blind plug and the sealing ring out of the screw connection from the inside outwards using a screwdriver or similar implement.

**NOTE**

To connect the AC and DC cables, the inverter is equipped with spring-loaded terminal strips.

## 2.3 Warnings

Each warning consists of the following elements:

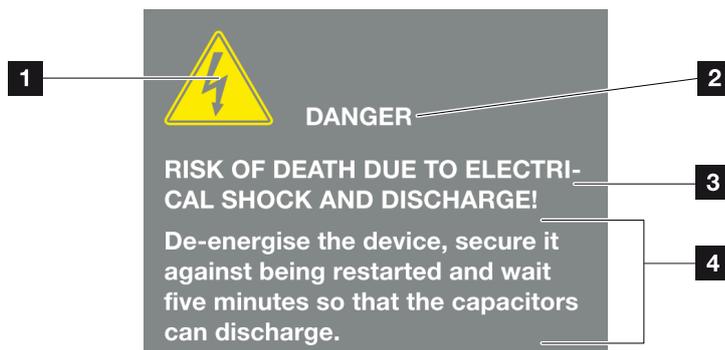


Fig. 4: Structure of warnings

## 2.4 Warning symbols



Danger



Danger due to electrical shock and discharge

### Signal words

Signal words are used to identify the severity of the danger.

#### **DANGER**

Indicates a direct hazard with a high level of risk, which, if not avoided, will result in death or serious injury.

#### **WARNING**

Indicates a hazard with a moderate level of risk, which, if not avoided, will result in death or serious injury.

**CAUTION** Indicates a hazard with a low level of risk, which, if not avoided, may result in minor or moderate injury or property damage.

## 2.5 Information notes

Information notes contain important instructions for the installation and smooth operation of the backup unit. These must be followed at all times. The information notes also point out that failure to observe can result in damage to property or financial damages.

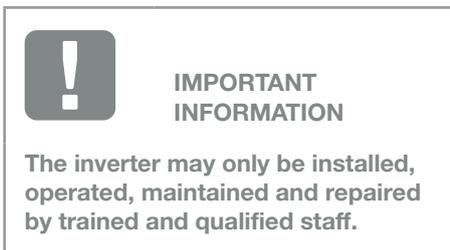


Fig. 5: Example of an information note

## 3. Prerequisites for using the KOSTAL Solar Portal

- The inverter must have a connection to the Internet.
- The inverter must not yet be assigned and registered to a system.
- If a KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter is installed in the system, it can transmit data to the solar portal. In PV systems with several inverters, it should also be integrated in the KOSTAL Solar Portal.  **Ch. 3.1** 

To use the KOSTAL Solar Portal, follow these two steps:

1. Data transfer to the KOSTAL Solar Portal must be activated in the inverter.  
(Activation can be performed using the Webserver or the inverter control panel.) 
2. Register (free of charge) on the KOSTAL Solar Electric GmbH website to use the KOSTAL Solar Portal.



### INFO

KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter  
firmware version 1.2.1 required.



### INFO

If there are several inverters in a system, data transfer to the KOSTAL Solar Portal must be set up separately for each inverter.

## 3.1 PV systems with KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter

In all PV systems in which a KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter has been installed at the grid connection point, this meter can transmit data to the KOSTAL Solar Portal. However, this is not necessary for all PV system variants. In addition, transmission must be activated in the KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter. Please refer to the operating manual for the KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter.



In principle, the PLENTICORE plus or PIKO IQ can transmit all the required data to the KOSTAL Solar Portal as a standalone device provided that the KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter is connected via RS485 and set up in the inverter.

In PV systems with a PIKO 4.2 - 20, if the KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter is connected via LAN/TCP, the KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter can also transmit data to the KOSTAL Solar Portal. In this case, the KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter in the KOSTAL Solar Portal must be integrated into the system in order to visualise the home consumption/self-consumption.

For PV systems with a PLENTICORE plus with battery and additional inverters in a PV system, the KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter must be installed at the grid connection point. In this case, the KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter in the KOSTAL Solar Portal must be integrated into the system in order to visualise the home consumption/self-consumption.

For PV systems with third-party inverters, the KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter can be used to record at least the entire feed-in to the public grid (all inverters including the third-party inverters). Direct consumption of the third-party inverters cannot currently be calculated with this setup because the information on the generation data of the third-party inverter is not transferred to the KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter.

## PV system types and device set-up in the KOSTAL Solar Portal

### ■ 1 x PLENTICORE plus

PLENTICORE plus with and without battery storage with connected and set-up KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter via RS485 on the inverter.

The PLENTICORE plus transmits data to the KOSTAL Solar Portal and must be assigned to a system and set up in the KOSTAL Solar Portal.

The KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter does **not** need to be set up in the KOSTAL Solar Portal.

### ■ 1 x PIKO IQ

PIKO IQ with connected and set-up KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter via RS485 on the inverter.

The PIKO IQ transmits data to the KOSTAL Solar Portal and must be assigned to a system and set up in the KOSTAL Solar Portal.

The KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter does **not** need to be set up in the KOSTAL Solar Portal.

### ■ 1 x PIKO MP plus as PV inverter

PIKO MP plus with connected and set-up KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter via RS485 on the inverter.

The PIKO MP plus transmits data to the KOSTAL Solar Portal and must be assigned to a system and set up in the KOSTAL Solar Portal.

The KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter does **not** need to be set up in the KOSTAL Solar Portal.

- **1 x PIKO MP plus as hybrid/battery inverter**

PIKO MP plus with connected BYD battery storage and KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter.

The inverter and the KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter transmit data to the KOSTAL Solar Portal. Both devices (inverter and KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter) must be assigned to a system and set up in the KOSTAL Solar Portal.

- **1 x PIKO 4.2-20 or 1 x PIKO BA with connected PIKO BA sensor**

The PIKO transmits data to the KOSTAL Solar Portal and must be assigned to a system and set up in the KOSTAL Solar Portal.

However, the difference here is the fact that the inverter can only record data provided that it is receiving energy from the solar modules or battery. As soon as this is no longer the case, no more home consumption can be recorded.

- **1 to n PIKO 4.2-20 and KSEM**

PIKO 4.2-20 with KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter at the grid connection point.

All inverters and the KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter transmit data to the KOSTAL Solar Portal and must be assigned to a system and set up in the KOSTAL Solar Portal.

- **Systems with several KOSTAL solar inverters, PLENTICORE plus, PIKO IQ**

The KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter must be installed at the grid connection point.

All inverters and the KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter transmit data to the KOSTAL Solar Portal and must be assigned to a system and set up in the KOSTAL Solar Portal.

- **Systems with several KOSTAL solar inverters and one PLENTICORE BI or PLENTICORE plus including battery**

The KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter must be installed at the grid connection point.

All inverters and the KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter transmit data to the KOSTAL Solar Portal and must be assigned to a system and set up in the KOSTAL Solar Portal.

- **Third-party inverters**

The KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter must be installed at the grid connection point.

For PV systems with third-party inverters, the KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter can be used to record at least the entire feed-in to the public grid (all inverters including the third-party inverters). Direct consumption of the third-party inverters cannot currently be calculated with this setup because the information on the generation data of the third-party inverter is not transferred to the KOSTAL Smart Energy Meter.

## 3.2 Connecting the inverter and computer

If the inverter and PC are already linked by means of a router, you can go straight to [Ch. 3.3](#).

If there isn't yet a link, connect the computer to the router using e.g. an Ethernet cable.

More information can be found in the inverter's operating manual.

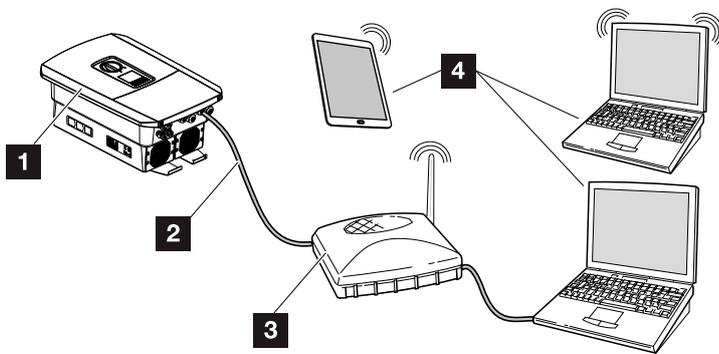


Fig. 7: Connecting inverter and computer

## 3.3 Activating data transfer to the KOSTAL Solar Portal via Webserver

### Calling up Webserver

1. Launch an Internet browser.
  2. Enter the IP address of the inverter in the address line of the browser and confirm with "Return". 
- The Webserver is called up.
3. To log in, click on Login and log in as plant owner.
- The Webserver's menu opens.



#### INFO

The description in this document refers to the PIKO IQ and PLENTICORE with Webserver UI 06.00 or higher.

For other inverters, please refer to the operating manual of the relevant inverter to find out how to activate data transfer to the solar portal.



#### TIP

The IP address can be queried in the inverter menu.

## Making settings in the Webserver

After logging in, the settings required can be configured on the inverter via the Webserver.

1. Go to the “Settings” page.
  2. Depending on the Webserver version, now go to “Portal Configuration” or “Solar Portal”.
  3. Select portal or enter portal code. 
  4. Activate data transfer to the solar portal. 
  5. Click on “Accept”.
- ✓ Data transfer to the KOSTAL Solar Portal is now enabled.



INFO

Portal code for KOSTAL Solar Portal = P3421



INFO

Data transfer to the KOSTAL Solar Portal can be activated or deactivated by clicking on the checkbox.

## Checking the data connection between the inverter and KOSTAL Solar Portal

If a value in minutes is displayed in the “Last portal connection” field, data has been transmitted to the KOSTAL Solar Portal. 

- ✓ The data connection between the inverter and the KOSTAL Solar Portal is functioning correctly.



INFO

The registration may take up to 20 minutes.

## 3.4 Activating data transfer to the KOSTAL Solar Portal on the inverter

To activate the KOSTAL Solar Portal on the inverter, proceed as follows.

### PIKO 10-20

1. Select the “Settings” menu on the inverter.
  2. Confirm with the “ENTER” key.
  3. Use the “UP” and “DOWN” keys to select the “Portal configuration” menu. 
  4. In the “Code:” field enter the code “P3421”.
  5. Press and hold down the “ENTER” key for approximately 3 seconds.
  6. Select the “Accept” field.
- ✓ You have now entered the portal code. Data transfer to the KOSTAL Solar Portal is now enabled.



#### INFO

This option can only be used with KOSTAL solar inverters running UI software version 4.06 and higher.



#### INFO

The menu item can be found under “Settings / Communication / Portal configuration”.

### PIKO IQ / PLENTICORE

1. Select the “Settings” menu on the inverter.
  2. Confirm with the “ENTER” key.
  3. Select the “Solar Portal” menu.
  4. Select a solar portal.
  5. Activate data export.
  6. Select the “Accept” field.
- ✓ You have now entered the portal code. Data transfer to the KOSTAL Solar Portal is now enabled.

## **PIKO MP plus**

Data transfer is automatically activated on the PIKO MP plus.

Once the network connection has been established, the inverter automatically begins transferring data to the KOSTAL Solar Portal.

If automatic transfer is not desired, you can remove the network cable or deactivate data transfer under “Settings” > “Network”.

## **PIKO CI**

With the PIKO CI, data transfer to the KOSTAL Solar Portal is activated by default.

## 4. The KOSTAL Solar Portal

### Registration

7. Go to the KOSTAL Solar Portal home page (www.kostal-solar-portal.com).
8. If you do not yet have an account, you can create one by clicking on “Register for free now!”. To do this, click on the “Join now” button.
  - The “Create User Account” page appears.
9. Complete the registration form and agree to the terms of use. 
10. To confirm the registration, click on the “Send registration” button.
  - We will send you an e-mail to confirm your registration.
11. Open this e-mail and click on the link.
  - This opens the “KOSTAL Solar Portal | Registration” page and reports “Registration finished”.
  - ✓ Registration in the KOSTAL Solar Portal is complete.



#### INFO

Pay attention to the fields highlighted in red in the input masks. These fields are required entry fields and must be completed.

## Login on KOSTAL Solar Portal

1. Go to the KOSTAL Solar Portal home page ([www.kostal-solar-portal.com](http://www.kostal-solar-portal.com)).
2. Enter your e-mail address and password in the login area.

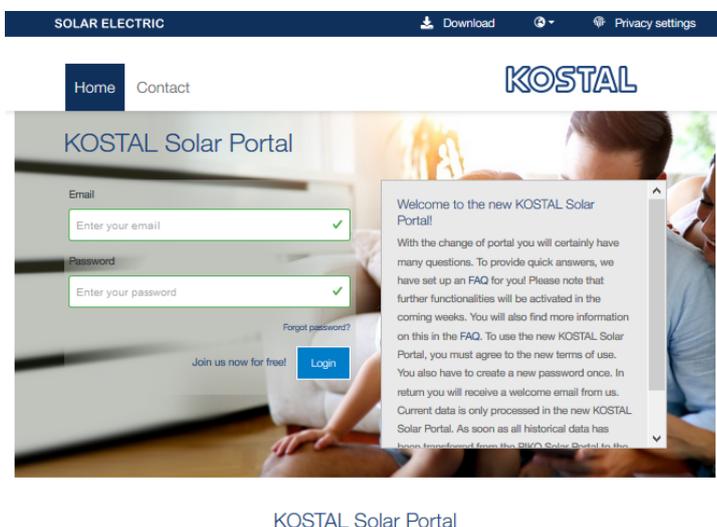


Fig. 8: Login area

3. Click on the “Log in” button.
  - The dashboard of the KOSTAL Solar portal appears.
  - ✓ You have logged into the KOSTAL Solar Portal.

## 4.1 Creating a system in the KOSTAL Solar Portal

4. Log into the KOSTAL Solar Portal. **!**
  5. To set up an inverter, a system must first be created.  
To do this, under the heading “System overview” click on the button “Create new system”.
- The “Create new system” page appears.  
Here you can set up a system. **!**

Create new site

### INFO

Before you can register the inverter on the KOSTAL Solar Portal, the inverter has to log into the KOSTAL Solar Portal. This may take up to 20 minutes from first being set up in the inverter.



### INFO

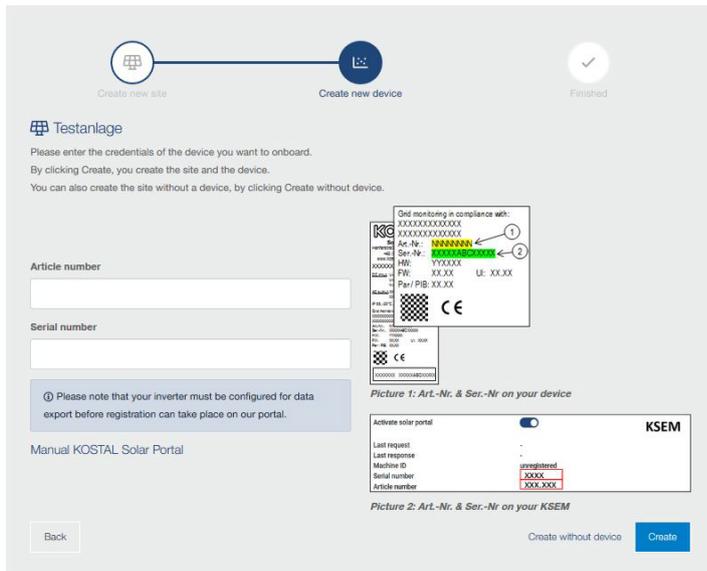
You can also create a system here for someone else (e.g. as an installer for a customer).

To do this, click on the “for someone else” button. He or she will then be notified about the setup by e-mail.

6. Enter the system data and click on “Create”.

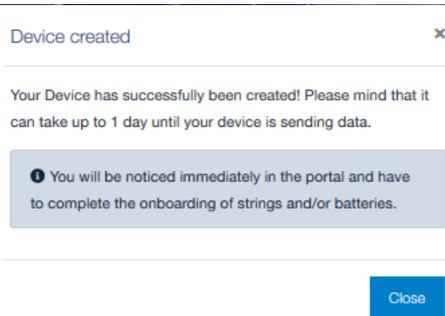
→ The “Create new device” page appears.

7. Enter the article number and serial number of the inverter here. These can be found on the inverter's type plate. Click on “Create”. 

→ When the inverter is found, it is added to the system.

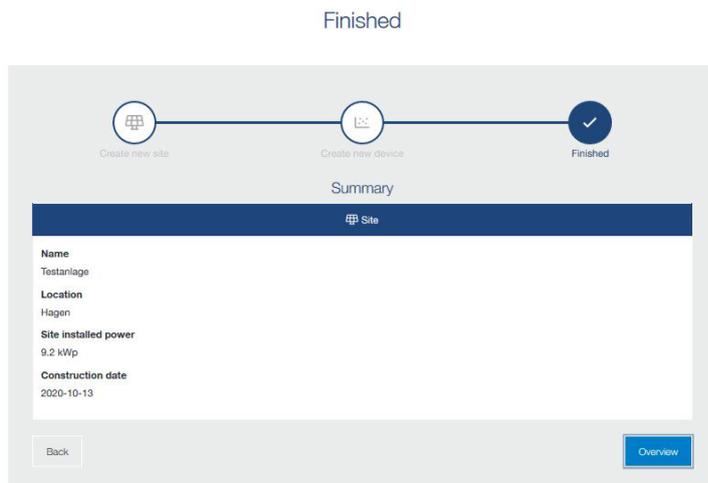


INFO

If you do not yet have an inverter or if it has not yet logged into the portal, you can initially also create the system without devices and add devices at a later time by going to “System > Configuration > Devices”.

8. Close the window by clicking on the “Close” button.

→ A summary appears.



9. A system with inverter has been created. Close the window by clicking on the “Overview” button.

→ This opens the “KOSTAL Solar Portal | System List” page.

✓ The new system is now displayed in the system list.

## 4.2 System overview

### Calling up the system webpage

1. Log into the KOSTAL Solar Portal.
  2. Click on “System overview”.
  3. Click on the name of the system you want.
- ✓ The webpage of the system appears with all relevant system data.

In the system overview, you can see all the systems that have been created.

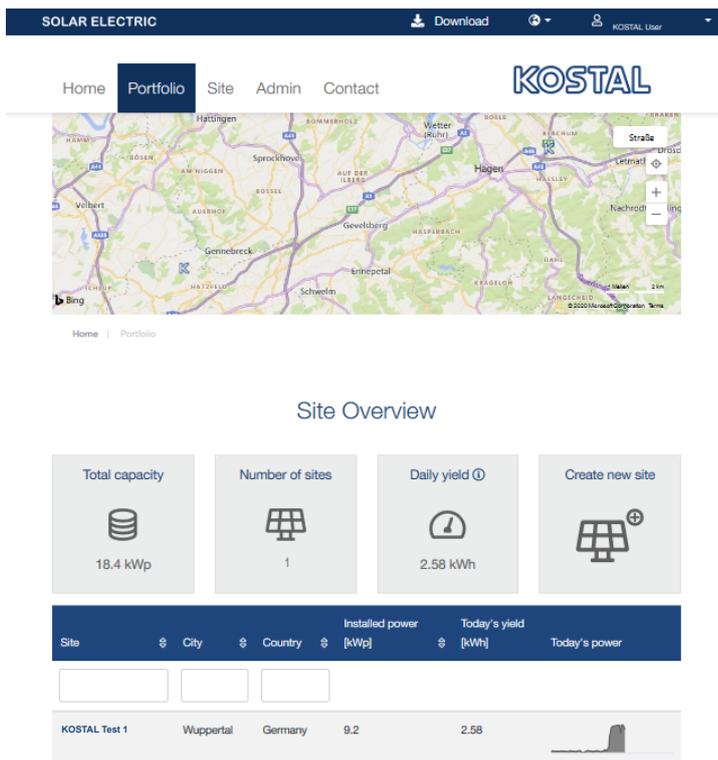


Fig. 9: System overview

After a system has been selected, the overview with all relevant measured values appears.

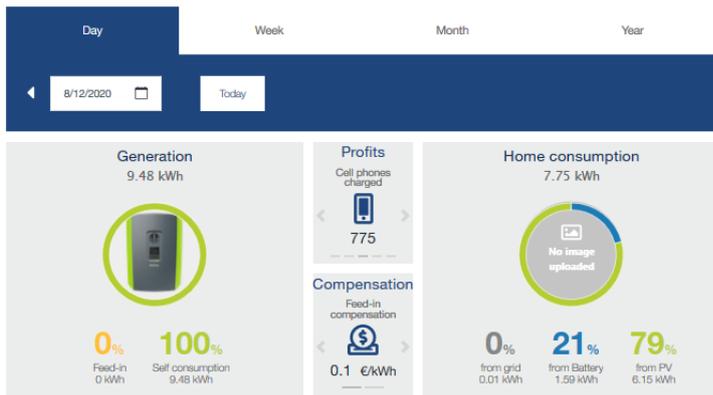


Fig. 10: Selected PV system

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
